

EVENTS ORGANISED BY MEA

During the past year 2021 the MEA was very active in the organization of several keynote events. Nearly all our events were held on-line.

January

On 12th January, the MEA collaboration with New Horizons Institute for Work Competencies organized a webinar for HR and Line Manager to present its training programme: Award in Leading People at the Workplace, an accredited Award at level 5. February

 The MEA in collaboration with Agenzija Sapport organised 2 Training Sessions for its members on the INK project on 9 and 17 February.

March

The main aim of the webinar was to instigate discussion amongst employers in the private sector about the challenges and opportunities being faced when dealing with transport.

April

May

 On 19th May, the MEA organised a 'Virtual visit to the EESC. During the 'visit' it was explained what are the roles of EESC, MEA's involvements, subjects being discussed and how employers can voice their opinions and be part of EU social dialogue. There were interventions by Mr Stefano Mallia (President of the EESC Employers Group), Ms Dolores Sammut Bonnici (Member of the EESC Employers Group and Senior Vice-President of MEA). Mr Georgios Meleas from EESC gave an overall of EESC's works and Ms Sophie Zimmer spoke on the discussions held on minimum wage.

June

August

September

On 28th September, Mr Joseph Farrugia, Director General of the Malta Employers' Association together with Mr Joe Gerada the Managing Director of New Horizons Institute gave out the awards to the participants who successfully followed the level 5 Course on 'Leading People at the Work Place' and 'Resolving Conflict and Mediation'.



October

COURSES ORGANISED BY MEA

As many of our members know, the Malta Employers' Association holds a number of courses throughout the year, and this year was no exception. Due to COVID-19, all our courses were held online.

Our most prominent courses are:

(1) Award in Employment Law Course

The course is an MQF Level 5 Award accredited by the National Commission for Further and Higher Education.

The aim of this course is to provide participants with a good working knowledge of the local legislation belonging to employment and industrial relations, including the main changes in the employment legislation. It also determines the extensive factors for an understanding of the rights and obligations of workers and their employers. The Employment and Industrial Relations Act, 2002 and the various regulations which followed is the main focus of the course, and it guides participants through the principles of effective employment practices. This method enables them to understand implications of various employer employee relations.

(2) Award in Human Resources Management in Practice Course

The course is an MQF Level 5 Award accredited by the National Commission for Further and Higher Education.

The aim of this course is to equip participants with knowledge and skills associated to the HR function. Taught by 19 different tutors with high experience in the field, this course covers topics like Social Dialogue, Corporate Social Responsibility, Discipline & Dealing with Dismissals, Managing a Diverse Workforce. Recruitment & Selection, Basics of Occupational Health & Safety, amongst others. The idea behind development of this course was to create a space where students, most of which are HR practitioners themselves, share the challenges experiences of their work, and learn from experts in the field on how to apply management strategies and practices.

(3) Award in Leading People at the Workplace

The course is an MQF Level 5 Award accredited by the National Commission for Further and Higher Education. It is being delivered and awarded by New Horizons (Institute for Work Competencies), in collaboration with the Malta Employers' Association.

This course focuses on giving participants the essential skills and competences needed for effective leadership. It is aimed at line managers and supervisors.

(4) Employment: Fiscal & Practical Considerations Course

This course is organised by PricewaterhouseCoopers, in collaboration with the Malta Employers' Association.

The main objective of this course is to engage participants into the legislative and technical aspects of payroll computation. Topics covered through the course include payroll management which involves knowledge about the complexities of income tax computations. social security. exemptions and other employer obligations involved in the correct computation of different aspects of remuneration. Participants learn about taxation and other compliance issues which form an intricate element of employing people.

(5) Remote Working for Entrepreneurs and Business Leaders

This course is organized by MEA together with MISCO.

The course deals with opportunities and challenges of having a remote workforce. Topics covered through the course pertain to remote working and teleworking; rights and obligations for the employers; implementation of working with an effective communication strategy; and managing the remote worker. The course gives practical examples of how employers and managers can work effectively to have strong and sustainable workplaces.

We would like to thank all those who attended our courses this year. We believe that it is important for HR personnel and managers to keep themselves abreast with the latest legislation. Our courses are limited to a small number of participants in order to enable interaction between the participants, which has become a trademark of the courses organized by MEA.

MEA ONLINE HR HANDBOOK



The MEA HR Handbook, which saw its inception 14 years ago, presently consists of an online platform made up of 28 chapters on employment related topics. Innovative in its format, the

Handbook is a source of information that helps entrepreneurs to offer proper guidance and enhance their relationship between management and employees.

Within these 28 chapters, one can find 383 FAQs related to different topics.

With the outbreak of the pandemic, and in response to the high demand of queries in relation to changes in conditions of employment, MEA has added a separate section on how management can deal with issues raised during COVID-19. Being seen as a best practice of how business support organisations like MEA can assist SMEs in dealing with COVID-19, the Handbook has been recognised and advertised amongst international partners like IOE and BUSINESSMED, and MEA has been praised on how innovative it is offering its assistance.

It is estimated that in the last 5 years, 8,000 visitors accessed and made use of this online tool.

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TRIBUNAL

The objective of this newsletter, which is issued quarterly, is to provide you with a brief background and outcome of selected industrial tribunal cases. This information will provide you with a better understanding in dealing with similar cases that may arise in your organisations, particularly when dealing with dismissal cases.

MEA provides professional assistance in industrial tribunal cases as part of the subscription. More importantly, secretariat is there to offer its advice before a decision to terminate is taken. This advice is often influential in determining the decision of the Industrial Tribunal should an employee dismissed, as in many cases the decision is based not simply on whether there were grounds of dismissal or otherwise, but also on whether the correct procedures were implemented. The newsletter also includes cases that are not related to dismissals and are of interest to employers, such as union recognition.


